Act I

In the country, the elderly Madame Armfeldt is imparting wisdom to her young granddaughter Fredrika, who lives with her while her mother. Desirée Armfeldt, tours as an actress. Madame Armfeldt tells Fredrika to watch for the three smiles of a summer evening. In the city, Fredrik Egerman, a middleaged lawyer, takes his young second wife, Anne, to the theatre where Desirée is performing. Fredrik and Desirée were once lovers. Passion rekindled. Fredrik visits Desirée later that night, only to be caught by (and successfully escape) her current lover, the very jealous Carl-Magnus, Count Malcolm. Meanwhile, Fredrik's grown son, Henrik, a divinity student, who is in love with his step-mother (Anne), has a brief encounter with Petra (the Egerman's maid). Desirée realizes she is finally ready to settle down (with Fredrik) and persuades her mother, Madame Armfeldt, to invite the . Eaermans for a "Weekend in the Country". Desirée's daughter, Fredrika, is delighted her mother is coming home. Charlotte Malcolm (Carl- Magnus' wife) learns about the weekend Egerman. invitation from Anne Charlotte encourages Anne to accept and then Charlotte reports back to Carl- Magnus. He decides they must crash the house party.

Act II

The Egermans and the Malcolms arrive in the country with their servants. Desirée now has a delicate balancing act between Fredrik and Carl-Magnus. The situation is further complicated by Charlotte's plot to make Carl-Magnus jealous by pursuing Fredrik herself. After many encounters in every possible combination, the characters are rearranged and the night smiles the third time.

Dr. Kathleen Ruhleder teaches music at Snead State Community College in Boaz, Alabama. Dr. Ruhleder has previously taught at Houston Community College, Colorado Mesa University, and at the Maricopa Community Colleges in Phoenix.

Performance highlights include the operatic roles Suzuki in Madam Butterfly and The Witch in Hansel and Gretel with High Dessert Opera, three educational tours with Arizona Opera, and opera chorus positions with Houston Grand Opera, Arizona Opera and Phoenix Opera.

Dr. Ruhleder has performed as a soloist with the Phoenix Symphony, Tucson Symphony, Grand Junction Symphony, Scottsdale Symphony and Symphony of the Southwest. She has extensive experience singing with professional choral ensembles including Bach Society Houston, Houston Chamber Choir, Phoenix Chorale, and more.



David Kravitz | Fredrik Egerman

Hailed as "a charismatic baritone" by the New York Times, "magnificently stentorian and resonant" by Opera News, and "a first-rate actor" by Opera (UK), David Kravitz's recent opera engagements include lead roles at Washington National Opera (Davis Miller in the world premiere of Approaching Ali), Chautauqua Opera (Captain Balstrode in Peter Grimes), Skylight Music Theatre (Scarpia in Tosca), Opera Santa Barbara (The Forester in The Cunning Little Vixen), Grand Harmonie (Don Pizarro in Fidelio), Opera Saratoga (Don Magnifico in La Cenerentola), Charlottesville (Ash Lawn) Opera (Tevye in Fiddler on the Roof), Boston Lyric Opera (Abraham in Clemency), Emmanuel Music (Nick Shadow in The Rake's Progress and Nick Carraway in Great Gatsby), and the New England The Philharmonic (Wozzeck in Wozzeck).

He created the lead role of De Sade in Nicola Moro's Love Hurts at the Piccolo Teatro in Milan, Italy, and at Symphony Space in New York. His many concert appearances include the Boston Symphony Orchestra, the Philadelphia Orchestra, the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra, the Baltimore Symphony, the Virginia Symphony, the Santa Fe Chamber Music Festival, Emmanuel Music, Boston Modern Orchestra Project, and Boston Baroque.

An exceptionally versatile artist, Mr. Kravitz's repertoire ranges Verdi to Sondheim to from Bach to cuttina-edae contemporary composers such as Matthew Aucoin. Mohammed Fairouz, Paul Moravec, and Elena Ruehr, Mr. Kravitz has recorded for the Naxos, BIS, Sono Luminus, Koch International Classics, BMOP/sound, Albany Records, and New World labels. His distinguished legal career has included clerkships with the Hon. Sandra Day O'Connor and the Hon. Stephen Brever.



Hannah Lawrence | Anne Egerman

Coloratura soprano Hannah Lawrence is an emerging young artist based in Mobile, Alabama. She has recently received her Master's degree at the University of South Alabama in Vocal Performance. She has performed roles such as Barbarina in Le Nozze di Figaro, La Fèe in Cendrillon, Giannetta in L'elisir d'amore, Kate in The Pirates of Penzance, and First Witch in Dido and Aeneas. An upcoming engagement includes Anne Egerman in A Little Night Music with Opera Huntsville.

Ms. Lawrence has received numerous distinguished awards competing in Alabama and Tennessee NATS. She is also a district competitor in the <u>2023-2024</u> Metropolitan Opera Laffont Competition in January.



Philip McCown | Henrik Egerman

Philip, tenor, is an Alabama and Atlanta based singer and choral conductor. He holds an undergraduate degree from Auburn University where he studied with Dr. Matthew Hoch, and a masters degree from Indiana University, where he studied with Peter Volpe. Philip is currently pursuing his DMA at The University of Alabama, studying Voice with Dr. David Tayloe and Choral Conducting with Dr. Morgan Luttig.

Philip has has performed a vast span of repertoire. His most notable roels are: Nermorino (L'elisir D'amore), Don Ottavio (Don Giovanni), Ralph Rachstraw (HMS Pinafore), Bardolph Laurie (Little Women). (Falstaff) Eisenstein (Die Fledermaus), and Aeneas (Dido and Aeneas). He has performed at The Atlanta Opera, Opera Birmingham, Opera Huntsville, Druid City Opera, Indiana University Opera and Ballet Theater, and The University of Alabama Opera Theatre. In addition to opera, Philip enjoys singing concert works and has been featured as a Soloist in Franz Joseph Havdn's Lord Nelson Mass. Handel's Messiah, and Charles Wood's Saint Mark Passion

Philip is equally at home on the podium as well as the stage. He has served at Assistant Conductor for the Auburn University Men's Chorus and Director of the Schola Cantorum at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church in Auburn, AL. He has prepared choruses for operas and master works such as: Handel's Messiah, Viviald's Gloria, Rutter's Gloria, Verdi's Requiem, Lucia di Lammermoor, and Rigoletto. Philip currently serves as Assistant Conductor for the University Chorus at Alabama, and is the Chorus Master for Druid City Opera in Tuscaloosa, AL.



Chris Farley | Count Carl-Magnus Malcolm

Christopher Blake Farley is a baritone from Morris, Alabama. Mr. Farley is the most recent winner of the Vann Vocal Institute Competition top prize and received an Encouragement award from the Laffont Competition hosted by the Metropolitan Opera in 2023.

He performed as Giuseppe in Gilbert and Sullivan's The Gondoliers, Gianni Schicchi in Puccini's Gianni Schicchi, both with the University of Alabama Opera Theatre, and Gabriel von Eisenstein in Strauss's Die Fledermaus with Opera Huntsville. Additional roles include Danilo in The Merry Widow with Birmingham Music Club, Belcore in The Elixir of Love with Opera Huntsville, and the Pirate King in The Pirates of Penzance with Opera Birmingham. Mr. Farley performed an internationally televised recital at the Eternal , Word Television Network (EWTN) alonaside Dr. Sadie Goodman and organist/music director Derek Kluz for the network's Lenten Musical Meditations. Christopher holds degrees from the University of Alabama at Birmingham and the Mannes School of Music at The New School and is currently pursuing the Doctor of Musical Arts degree at the University of Alabama.



Shannon Rose McAuliffe | Countess Charlotte Malcolm Shannon Rose McAuliffe maintains an active freelance schedule spanning solo recitals, chamber music, oratorio, and operatic genres. Her performances encompass repertoire ranging from historically informed periodinstrument interpretations of Baroque music to world premieres of works by living composers. She has been praised for her "ability to create tender moments onstage," and her character work runs the aamut of roles, traversing tormented queens, cabaret strumpets, and cheeky sidekicks. She is also a trained voice actor and improvisation artist. Recent and upcoming appearances include engagements with Opera Huntsville, the MIT Symphony Orchestra, Music at Marsh Chapel, the Henry Purcell Society of Boston, Tallahassee Bach Parley, and the Hans Zimmer Live tour. She has recorded for a number of independent projects in popular genres, with the Vox Futura recording choir, and on the Naxos label. In addition to her work as a singer, her musicological pursuits focus on femicide in opera; she has presented individually and co-authored presentations on this topic at multiple national conferences.

Ms. McAuliffe holds adjunct and lecturer positions at Emerson College, Boston University, and Northeastern University. She earned her Bachelor of Music degree in Music History and Voice from the University of Massachusetts, and completed graduate studies in Historical Performance, Musicology, and Arts Administration at Boston University.



Sarah Nordin | Mme. Armfeldt

Praised by Opera News for the "clear beauty" of her voice and her "spot-on comic timing," mezzo-soprano Sarah Nordin brings an exquisite blend of vocal artistry and strong dramatic instincts to a broad range of repertoire.

Known for her interpretations of Rossini and Mozart, she has been featured in recent seasons as Rosina in II Barbiere di Siviglia with Opera Orlando and Gulf Coast Symphony as well as the title role in La Cenerentola with Geneva Light Opera. Likewise, her Cherubino and Marcelina in Le Nozze di Figaro, Zerlina and Elvira in Don Giovanni, Isabella in L'Italiana in Algeri and Dorabella in Cosi fan Tutte have charmed audiences at Opera Tampa, Long Island Lyric Opera, Opera Orlando, Gulf Shore Opera, St. Petersburg Opera, Landlocked Opera, Taconic Opera and Winter Opera of St. Louis.

In addition, Ms. Nordin has sung the title role of Carmen, Maddalena in Rigoletto, Charlotte in Werther, Nicklausse in Tales of Hoffmann, Suzuki in Madama Butterfly, Komponist in Ariadne auf Naxos and Orlofsky in Die Fledermaus in multiple venues, including First Coast Opera, Belcantanti Opera, the Missouri Symphony, and Hubbard Hall Opera Theatre. She has also been heard at the Caramoor Festival, Opera Theatre of St. Louis, Central City and Opera North and has appeared in six productions with The Metropolitan Opera as a member of the ensemble. These performances include three Met Live in HD Broadcasts and a tour with The Met to Japan. In 2021, Sarah made her solo debut at Carnegie Hall singing a concert of Turkish and Azerbaijani folk songs for the Azerbaijani Association of Cultural Affairs. New works and Musicals comprise a significant part of Sarah Nordin's career. Most notably, she premiered the role of Mary Eden Thompson in The Circuit Rider's Wife, which included a three-year tour and original cast recording, Lydia in Penelope Ann's Revenge, a sequel to Arthur Sullivan's Cox and Box, The Conductress in the world premiere of Un bocca al lupo and she premiered the role of Annie Jump Cannon in Galaxies in her Eyes. Her favorite classic Musical Theater roles performed are Nellie in South Pacific, Maria in Sound of Music, Sandy in Grease and Tzeital in Fiddler on the Roof.

Ms. Nordin is also an award-winning ballroom dancer and an accomplished french horn player.

Previous Music Director positions include six seasons with the Brookline Symphony Orchestra, three seasons with the Southern Arizona Symphony Orchestra, five seasons with Opera in the Ozarks, and five seasons with MetroWest Opera. Boyles also served on the faculty at The University of Texas at Austin and The University of Arizona.

With the Hartford Symphony Orchestra, Boyles conducts a wide variety of Masterworks, Pops, Talcott Mountain Music Festival, and Educational concerts. He conducted the entirety of the orchestra's 2018 summer season, including a concert in collaboration with Doc Severinsen.

Recent guest engagements include concerts with the Tucson Symphony Orchestra, Ocean City Pops Orchestra, Charlottesville Symphony Orchestra, and honors orchestras in Massachusetts, Nevada, Tennessee, Oregon, and Rhode Island. Boyles is a regular clinician with Manhattan Concert Productions, and Massachusetts Instrumental and Choral Conductors Association.

An accomplished vocalist, Boyles performed in numerous operas with the Indiana University Opera Theater, and in Arizona Opera's first complete presentation of Wagner's Der Ring des Nibelungen. He has sung with many professional choral ensembles across the country such as Conspirare, True Concord, Apollo's Voice, Mon Choeur, and Cantique. In 2010, Boyles was featured as a guest soloist with the Tanglewood Festival Chorus. Boyles received his Doctor of Music in Orchestral Conducting degree from The University of Texas at Austin, his Master of Music in Orchestral Conducting degree from The University of Arizona, and his Bachelor of Music in Vocal Performance degree from Indiana University.
